Rule changes effective Aug. 1, 2023


The USBC Board has approved the addition of two (2) new rules to the General Playing Rules:

<u>Rule 4f</u> – Two-Handed Techniques - This rule clarifies the difference between a two-handed approach and a two-handed delivery.

<u>Rule 19</u> – String Pin Bowling - This rule explains the recognition of String Pin Bowling beginning August 1, 2023, when the center has string pinsetters that comply with USBC specifications. 2023-2024 Playing Rules and Commonly Asked Questions

The 2023-24 USBC Rulebook is now posted and can be accessed <u>here</u>. The rulebook is available online and through the BOWL.com app. Added features this year include the addition of a Table of Contents with direct links to rules and the inclusion of links throughout the rulebook that will provide quick access to referenced rules and CAQ's.

Everything rules can now be found on the new <u>Rules page</u> of bowl.com. General, league and tournament resource sections provide you with a wide breadth of information to help you, as an officer, run more effective and efficient leagues.



Adult/Youth Leagues

Adult leagues allowing USBC Youth members 18 or younger to participate must be certified as an adult/youth league, must comply with USBC Rule 400 and those 18 or older must complete U.S. Center for SafeSport training. All officers must be a Registered Volunteer (SafeSport trained and background screening through NCSI).

Youth Leagues

Promote your scholarship leagues. If you have unassigned funds in your SMART account, use them to promote bowling. Inform the parents/youth that you are adding additional scholarship funds to the prize fund, or have

the youth/parents help promote your leagues. For example: Everyone receives prizes in the form of scholarships, and for each new bowler you bring in, you both receive scholarship funds. This is a great way to have others promote your leagues.

Don't forget when certifying your league, include your SMART account number on the league application.
