

Roll-off (also known as a tiebreaker)

Many leagues use the term roll-off for the championship playoffs when, in fact, a roll-off is a tiebreaker. A roll-off, according to Rule 118, must be conducted when there is a tie for first place at the end of a segment or the season (unless co-champions are declared). Scores from a roll-off must be added into a bowler's average record.

Playoff (also known as the championship)

Most playoffs are connected to <u>split seasons</u>. A split season is when a league divides the standings into segments with the standings starting over once the previous segment is completed. This is a great way for a league to add interest and to give teams the opportunity to move up in the standings and compete in the championship playoff.

Dealing with weather issues

Tis the season for weather-related problems to start happening. The CAQ's attached to <u>Rule 117b</u> and <u>Rule 117d</u> provide guidance to leagues when faced with weather-related issues.






USBC COMPLETES CERTIFIED STRING PINSETTER SCORING RESEARCH – How does this affect my league?

The United States Bowling Congress has released its most recent scoring research report related to string pinsetters. The report concludes there is no statistically significant difference between the scoring pace of USBC-certified string pinsetters and traditional free-fall machines.

Therefore, an average conversion between the pinsetter types will not be necessary. USBC has updated its playing rules to allow for the averages between pinsetter types to be interchangeable provided the string pinsetter has been certified by USBC.

The full report, which can be found <u>here</u>, details the results of the participant testing and explains the differences in the current findings versus previous scoring research that utilized the USBC's automated Bowlscore ramp.


SafeSport Training Update

Youth Athlete Resources

The U.S. Center for SafeSport now has two free online courses for children of varied ages and their parents or caregivers. These courses introduce minor athletes to the importance of positive, welcoming environments in which bullying and abuse are not tolerated. The courses also let course takers know where to report abuse or misconduct if it occurs.

For all members taking SafeSport training, it is imperative to go through BOWL.com's Athlete Safety Portal. Visit BOWL.com, under the USBC heading, and click on Athlete Portal in the drop down. Enter your Community Login, and you will be taken to your exclusive Athlete Safety page from which you will access SafeSport training and your NCSI background screening.

As a reminder, all <u>league officers of Youth or Adult/Youth leagues</u> must be compliant with the annual SafeSport training and have a current background screening (done every two years).

Bowlers 18 or older who are participating in a Youth or Adult/Youth League must be compliant with the annual SafeSport training requirements.
